## AWARD-WINNING CARE MANAGEMENT SOLUTIONS:

Disease Management 3700, winner of the Governor’s Award for Quality and Productivity (Pinnacle Award), was the precursor to Healthcare Home. The project goal is simple—find unconnected, high-cost Medicaid users and connect them with a Coalition provider to assist with keeping medical appointments, improve health lifestyle, and facilitate adherence to medication. In addition to saving the state **\$9 million** in reduced Medicaid costs, the project strives to change lives—*People with severe mental illness die 25 years earlier than the general population, primarily due to physical health conditions.*

OLD MODEL:



Individuals seek services and must be evaluated for eligibility.

NEW MODEL:



Providers reach out to selected high-cost, high-risk individuals that the payer has selected for services.

### HEALTHCARE HOME:

THE CARE MANAGEMENT SOLUTION TO IMPROVE HEALTH OUTCOMES AND LOWER COSTS FOR THOSE SUFFERING WITH SEVERE MENTAL ILLNESS

- ◆ 17,000 Missourians with severe mental illness receive whole health care management.
- ◆ Already coordinating with managed care plans; participant list shared to avoid duplication
- ◆ Measuring and improving health outcomes around obesity, cholesterol, blood pressure, and other chronic diseases
- ◆ Reducing ER admission and re-admission to hospitals
- ◆ **BETTER HEALTH OUTCOMES**—Reduced obesity, better medication adherence, appropriate use of care, etc.
- ◆ **SAVING STATE MONEY**—Early projections indicate annualized savings of \$17 million.

The Department of Mental Health divides the state into 25 service areas to ensure coordinated and accountable care for individuals suffering with mental illness. Along with its affiliated providers and substance abuse provider network, each designated Community Mental Health Center (governed by a community-based, not-for-profit board) serves as the primary entry and exit point for state mental health services. The Community Mental Health Centers are responsible in their assigned areas for assessment and services for both adult and youth clients and for providing follow-up services for individuals released from state-operated hospitals. Coalition members also operate the state's crisis phone system, which provides 24/7 assistance and rapid response coverage. The 32 provider members of the Coalition employ more than 9,000 Missourians, providing treatment and support services to 250,000 people each year.
